The Latest and Greatest in Digital Dentistry

Digital dentistry has been evolving rapidly over the last 10 years with restorative techniques in the forefront of the field. Novel technologies have been used in both the clinic and laboratory with a goal of manufacturing restorations quickly, easily, and more accurately. In addition, patients are more attracted to the digital workflow than conventional techniques. This lecture will present novel techniques for the fabrication of removable complete and partial prostheses, chair-side CAD/CAM fixed provisional and final restorations, printed diagnostic models and wax-ups, and more.

An Overview of Common Oral Lesions: Diagnosis and Management

Dentists are first-line providers for patients with oral lesions. Appropriately diagnosing and managing oral mucosal diseases can be challenging, and patients often see several providers before obtaining a correct diagnosis. A sound understanding of oral mucosal diseases and following a systematic approach to diagnosis can help prevent unnecessary office visits, diagnostic tests, treatments, and most importantly, a delayed diagnosis. This presentation will outline common conditions affecting the oral soft tissues and how to manage them. It will aid clinicians in forming differential diagnoses and in understanding how to order appropriate diagnostic tests. Further, it will highlight the importance of a comprehensive oral health examination.

At the conclusion of this presentation, attendees will be able to:

1. Formulate a differential diagnosis for common oral lesions.
2. Define the etiology for various oral lesions.
3. Describe management strategies for common oral lesions.
4. Differentiate between benign and malignant oral lesions.
5. Implement a strategy for when to refer suspicious oral lesions.

R. Todd Erickson, DDS, MS, Associate Professor of Radiology at ASDOH, is a graduate of Creighton University School of Dentistry. Dr. Erickson received a certificate in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery from Detroit-Malcomb Hospital Corp. and worked in private practice for more than a decade before earning a Master of Science in Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology from the University of North Carolina.

Carlos Jurado, DDS, MS, is an Assistant Professor of Clinical Digital Dentistry at Arizona School of Dentistry & Oral Health. Dr. Jurado earned a Certificate in Restorative Dentistry from UCLA and a Certificate in Operative Dentistry from USC. He earned his MS in Dental Materials and Certificate in Prosthodontics at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. Dr. Jurado was Co-Director of CAD/CAM Dentistry at Oregon Health and Science University School of Dentistry prior to joining ASDOH. He has lectured nationally and internationally and published extensively on dental materials and restorative topics.



Dr. Seena Patel obtained her DMD and MPH degrees from A.T. Still University Arizona School of Dentistry & Oral Health (Class of 2010) and completed a residency in Orofacial Pain and Oral Medicine at USC. Dr. Patel is an Associate Professor and Associate Director of Oral Medicine in the Advanced Care Clinic at ASDOH and also in private practice. She is a Diplomate of the American Board of Orofacial Pain and the American Board of Oral Medicine, and a member of the American Academy of Orofacial Pain, American Academy of Oral Medicine, Central Arizona Dental Society, Arizona Dental Association, American Dental Association, American Dental Education Association, and Special Care in Dentistry Association.
